From Dragon Bay studios, Jamaica, they produced one of the greatest Grammy winning albums; 20 years later, reggae producer Richard and English rocker Gordon seek to regain fame against a surreal backdrop of battling tenants, crumbling bungalows and a disapproving status quo.

SYNOPSIS

Flamboyant Studio owner and producer **RICHARD LOWE** is at his wit's end as his dream of breathing new life into the ultimate reggae studio on the most beautiful bay in the Caribbean is fast fading. However, fate intervenes and he connects with his long lost English rocker friend **GORDON BRIDGE** who he figures can float him some capital. Problem is, unknown to him, Gordon is also a bit worse for the wear. His latest hustle of managing an emerging group called **FIVE**, is a last desperate attempt to stay afloat. The two decide that forming a partnership would be their best bet and embark on a mission to bring glory back to the distinctive sound of **Dragon Bay Recording Studios**, which produced their major Grammy Award winning hit album. After successful years in the business locally and internationally the bottom has dropped out of the traditional studio industry as EDM and crossover Dancehall acts have spurned the studio and its hardcore session musicians, for more technology based sounds.

But the road back is paved with quite a few good old Jamaican "rockstones" including the curious mix of owners of the three cottages, which Richard had sold off during lean times. CARLOS, a local Opera singer of international acclaim that rumour says was deported for smuggling art; DONNY AND LAURA, a middle-aged American ex-hippie couple, who speak in stereo and are surreptitiously growing marijuana in RICHARD's greenhouse for the newly opened local medical marijuana industry; and BEKELE, a troubled, spoilt, young sculptress struggling for recognition who has made a pact to be celibate until she becomes famous. Despite many financial hills and gullies, under the skilful manoeuver of JUNIOR FRED, Richard's beleaguered young manager, they finally drop FIVE's first album. It's an instant hit and the studio takes off, becoming a veritable pop Mecca with old-school musicians and hot new acts creating eclectic cross-over sounds. However, the politics of the tourism industry soon play out as the studio brings a different kind of clientele to the quiet town. Restaurants, nightclubs and craft vendors experience a boom in business both from Richard and Gordon's clients making the status quo of high end villa owners very unhappy with the freewheeling lifestyle of the studios clients. To complicate matters there's ongoing drama with the emergence of a local Baby Mama that Gordon didn't know he had who is making claims on his wealth, threatening the partnership. Will all this stop the music?

PRODUCER

Justine Henzell is an independent film Producer and oversees the legacy of **The Harder They Come**, the award winning movie, co-written, produced and directed by her father, Perry Henzell, which continues to reach a global audience 45 years after its release.

Henzell has directed two feature length documentaries high-lighting the history of Jamaica. *One People - The Celebration* and *Jamaica Arise*. She is a founding member of the Jamaica Film & Television Association (JAFTA) and in 2016 initiated JAFTA Propella! which supports the production of 5 short films by Jamaican filmmakers annually.

Henzell is passionate about nuturing emerging talent and so has formed the Creatrix Collective to produce content exclusively directed by Jamaican women.

In addition to her work in film Justine is a Co-Founder and Producer of the Calabash International Literary Festival, which was first staged in 2001.



PRODUCER

Natalie Thompson is a Jamaican born Filmmaker and development and production specialist. She studied Drama at the professional Theatre at Edgecliff College in Cincinnati, Ohio beforegraduating with a Degree in Drama and Communication Arts (Film and Television) from the University of Windsor in Canada. Natalie returned to Jamaica and after 2 years as a Director at Noble Film Productions, she formed Cinecom Productions Limited in 1975. She quickly established herself as an award-winning commercial, documentary and industrial film Producer, Director and Editor, but wanted to move on to working with narrative projects.

Since 1980, Natalie has worked as a Production Manager and Line Producer on various feature films and TV productions shot on location in Jamaica. These include *Cocktail, Cool Runnings* and *Instinct* for Disney, *Prelude to a Kiss, How Stella Got Her Groove Back* and *Knight and Day* for Twentieth Century Fox. In Television she has Managed *Small Island* for Ruby Films/BBC, *Luke Cage* (Jamaica Episode) - Marvel Films, and *Top Boy* (Jamaica Episode) for Netflix. She has managed several Independent Feature productions including *Popcorn, Milk and Honey, Almost Heaven, Treasure Island* and *Marley* and local Jamaican productions *Third World Cop, Ghett'a Life* and *Sprinter.*

A past member of the International Board of Women in Film and Television, Natalie has been developing Jamaican and Caribbean content over the last ten years.
